# Donna's 60th Anniversary as our Organist and Choir Director

Last Sunday we celebrated Donna Knarr's 60 years at the organ of Emmanuel Church. It was quite a joyous occasion, with most of her family in attendance. Bryn Werley opened with a prelude on flute and Donna added her special touches to all the hymns (which were chosen because they were her favorites.) Donna played a piano arrangement of *Higher Ground* for the offeratory and Andrea (Knabb) Fioriglio and Bob Fluharty sang solos. The men of the choir rounded out the musical presentations by singing the do-wop version of *Donna*, with new lyrics written by Ron Frey and Butch Barr.



The congregation gave Donna gift certificates to American Music Theater and Wyomissing Family Restaurant and a permanent remembrance in the form of an engraved crystal plaque, photo below. A cake and punch reception followed and we are looking forward to planning her 70th anniversary service!

Congratulations to Donna Knarr on 60 years of music ministry!

Donna Knarr's first encounter with the Fleetwood United Methodist Church was in 1957 at the age of 15, while performing at a piano recital hosted by the church. After she played "Autumn Leaves" at that recital, Pastor Asher Gottshall, approached her and asked if she would be interested in studying the organ with the goal of becoming the church organist. The church was anticipating the retirement of their longtime organist and generously offered to pay for Donna's lessons. Donna says she was very appreciative of the opportunity this church gave her to learn under Marie Scheffly in Reading for 6 months. At the age of 16, Donna Knarr was officially hired as the church organist at Emmanuel Evangelical United Brethren Church (which then became Emmanuel UMC in the 1968 merger of the two denominations.)

Thirteen years later, at the age of 29, Donna also became the choir director after Ruth Adams retired from that position. She recalls having had many wonderful, dedicated choir members throughout the years. After spending every Monday evening at choir practice together for the past 60 years, you develop some special bonds. Donna states that some of her fondest memories at this church include many of the Easter and Christmas Cantatas that the choir performed for our church members and the surrounding community.

Donna especially enjoyed the times when various community members would join us to assist in making beautiful music for our special Christmas programs. Dave Stahl, professional trumpet player and church member, Alton Smith (Donna's uncle) and trumpet player, Bobby

Schaeffer, trumpeter and Rick Keller, trombonist, were some of the many musicians that assisted in making some wonderful musical memories.

For many years, Donna also led out with our church's junior choir. With the many talented youth from the Hunter, Werst and Frey families, to name a few, she also led a small youth orchestra with clarinet, saxophone, trumpet and flutes.

Over the past 60 years, Donna recalls working with a variety of pastors, 10 in all. She worked with Pastors Asher Gottshall, R. R. Umberger, G. J. Hunsberger, Susan Hassinger, John Taylor, Kenneth Kline, Colleen Kristula, Glenn Brown, George Sackett and currently, Mark Dricker.

There was one very important Sunday a very long time ago that Donna needed to have off and take a vacation day. She was not able to work the Sunday while on her honeymoon. This was very strategically planned, since that was the week that the choir went to perform at the prison and they were all placed on lock down during an attempted prison break.

Donna's most challenging moment at this church was at the age of 21, while 8 months pregnant, she was playing for a Christmas program. Right in the middle of playing the "Hallelujah Chorus", all of her organ music fell onto her lap. She continued to play with her right hand, while trying to pick up the music and return it to the music holder on the organ. Knowing Donna, she never missed a beat.

Donna acknowledges the support of her musical endeavors by her husband, Tom, during their 58 years of marriage. She also has 3 married daughters, 1 son, 10 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. When Donna has free time, she loves to play the piano, and attend band and Christian music concerts whenever possible. Donna and Tom love to travel and have been to 5 continents, and 38 countries.

At the age of 16, Donna says she never would have imagined, that she would still be playing the organ for this congregation 60 years later. She has thoroughly enjoyed her years here and loves the church family of Emmanuel United Methodist Church. May God continue to bless Donna's musical ministry here!

#### **Our Attendance At Worship**

Worship is a privilege only children of God have. There are many blessings we receive from faithful attendance in worship. God has commanded us to assemble regularly to worship Him in spirit and in truth (John 4:24). Hebrews 10:25-27 says, "Not Forsaking The Assembling Of Ourselves Together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the day approaching. For If We Sin Willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, There No Longer Remains A Sacrifice For Sins, but a certain fearful expectation of judgment, and fiery indignation." When we forsake the assembly of the church, except for sickness or circumstances beyond our control, we are not only disobeying God, but we are robbing ourselves of all the benefits of worship which would have helped us to grow and become spiritually strong.

By forsaking the assembly, we also endanger our souls because as the above verse says, "For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for our sins." Christ is our only sacrifice for sin. When people reject their only sacrifice for sin there remains nothing but "a certain fearful expectation of judgment and fiery indignation."

When people fall away from the Lord, it is usually not a sudden thing. They usually start by forsaking the assembly on Sunday mornings. This is the usual path for most people

who fall away. Oh, some may come back and "visit" several times a year and a few may even attend our Sunday morning worship with little regularity.

Let's not lose our souls by unfaithfulness.
